

Peeking Caddis

Hook	#14 nymph, 2x long
Thread	black
Lead	0.15
Tinsel	oval, gold
Dubbing	Streamside Hare's Ear and Dubbin Dark Hare's Ear pre-mixed dubbing, black and lime green
Legs	Streamside English Grouse Soft Hackle (This type of hackle is dark and has some pattern.)



1. Wrap the hook with black thread to form the base.
2. Wrap about 12 to 15 turns of lead for weight.
3. Tie in small oval tinsel at the bend of the hook.
4. Starting at the bend of the hook and placing one wrap behind the tinsel on the bend side of the tinsel, wind the dubbing for the body forward about two-thirds of the length of the hook shank.
5. Counter wrap the tinsel over the dubbed body and tie it off.
6. Wrap lime-green dubbing over half the remaining hook shank.

7. Tie in legs on the underside of the fly. The legs should extend about the same distance as the hook gap.
8. Add black dubbing for the head, whip finish, and add head cement.

About this fly: Fish this fly near or on the bottom, and use it as an attractor or anchor fly with a Happy Pulik as the dropper. This combination is effective on the Crooked, Fall and Metolius rivers. For a fly that is smaller, lighter, and effective in slower water, tie this fly on a #16 hook with 0.10 lead.
