Ever wondered what the Metolius is like below Bridge 99? You've probably heard about fast water, rapids, and lots of brush; which is all true. It is also true that there is excellent fishing if you are willing to brave the elements and do some hiking. These fish are big and strengthened by the fast current.

I'll lead a club outing to this part of the river on February 6. Yes, this is the middle of winter, but it is my favorite time of year on the Metolius. The crowds are gone, the big fish have moved into the river from the lake (redbands and bulls), and the water temperature is still good, even if the air temperature is below freezing.

Don't expect to back cast much during the day. You might find a spot to do so, but a good roll cast or single-hand Spey cast is what you'll really need. Don't expect to use dry flies. I have been in hatches and got some fish on the surface (even in nine-degree air temperature), but this will mostly be a bobber-fishing experience.

In exchange for the effort and braving the cold, you might have the good luck I often do with fish that don't see as many fishermen. I need to keep this trip small as most spots can only handle an angler or two at a time, and we'll need to spread out. Feb 17 and 18 | Aspen Hall



We are very pleased to have Mike travel to Central Oregon for this two-day seminar. He will cover such topics as Spring Creek Magic, Fly Tying for Spring Creeks, Casting Instructions, Nymph Fishing from Top to Bottom, Techniques and Tactics for Difficult Trout, and Fly Fishing in the Upper Snake River Country.

Mike's knowledge, a lifetime of experience to share, and easy going style make him a most desirable presenter. He was born and raised in southeastern Idaho where he has fished the local streams and Yellowstone area, including the Henry's Fork, all his life. Mike graduated BYU in 1970, and while teaching school for several years, began tying flies commercially. Later he began working as a fishing guide in the area. In 1977 he and his wife, Sheralee, opened Henry's Fork Anglers Fly Shop, currently located in Island Park, ID. He lives in the area with his wife and two sons.

CONSERVATION

Aquatic species prevention permit

Beginning January 1, 2010, you will need an Aquatic Species Prevention Permit for your drift boat, canoe or inflatable pontoon boat over 10 feet long. Permits are transferable to other non-motorized boats, but each boat on the water needs a permit. Permits go on sale December 1 wherever ODFW licenses are sold and online:

Oregon boaters will soon be on the front lines of a war against aquatic invasive species. Beginning January 1, 2010, operators of manually powered boats (paddle craft) 10 feet or longer and all registered boats (power and sail) are required by a new law to purchase an Aquatic Invasive Species Permit to fund prevention and control programs.

The environmental protection law, created by the 2009 Oregon Legislature, is designed to protect Oregon's waters from destructive invaders including the quagga and zebra mussels that are rapidly spreading across the nation, degrading water quality, depleting native fish and waterfowl populations and costing millions of dollars in maintenance of water and power facilities. The new program will be implemented by the Oregon State Marine Board and the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife.

New Fees

- Registered boaters will pay an automatic \$5 surcharge as part of their boater registration.
- Out-of-state motorboat operators need to purchase an annual permit for \$22 (\$20 permit plus \$2 agent fee) through ODFW license agents, ODFW offices that sell licenses and on the ODFW Web site. Out-of-state permits will not be sold through boat registration agents or the Oregon State Marine Board.
- Non-motorized boat operators (canoes, kayaks, sailboats, drift boats, etc.) will need to purchase and carry an annual permit. Permits can be purchased starting December 1 at ODFW license agents, ODFW offices that sell licenses and on the ODFW Web site for a cost of \$7 (\$5 permit plus \$2 agent fee). Permits are required for both residents and nonresidents and are transferable to other nonmotorized craft, but every vessel on the water must have a permit.
- Guides, outfitters, livery operations and boating clubs should purchase their permits directly from the Oregon State Marine Board.

The Oregon State Marine Board and the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife are implementing the new Aquatic Invasive Species Program, which will include education outreach, voluntary boat inspections and decontamination of infected boats to stop the introduction and spread of aquatic invasive species.
